Dear Guidance Counselor:

I am writing to introduce you to four exciting opportunities for high school students, offered through Boston University Summer Term. These programs provide a preview of college life, combining academic challenge and a strong social community—making summer the perfect time for your students to experience campus life at Boston University and to get a head start on college.

- High School Honors is a six-week residential or commuter program in which students take two
 Boston University undergraduate courses, earning up to eight transferable college credits. We consider
 students entering their junior or senior year of high school in fall 2013.
- Research Internship in Science & Engineering is a six-week residential or commuter program in which students work in a lab conducting scientific research under the guidance of a mentor. Students must be entering their senior year of high school in fall 2013.
- **Summer Challenge** is a two-week residential program for students entering their sophomore, junior, or senior year in fall 2013. Students choose two out of 18 non-credit seminars.
- Summer Preview is a one-week commuter or residential program in which students can delve into one non-credit subject and look ahead to the college experience. Participants must be entering their freshman or sophomore year in fall 2013.

Each program includes a beneficial presentation by experienced Boston University Admissions officers, focusing on the best strategies for the college application process. In addition to providing an academic opportunity, our programs introduce students to the social dynamics of college life—and to the city of Boston. Every year, our students form strong friendships as they tackle their coursework and participate in a range of group activities designed to foster a tight-knit community, such as touring the city, following Boston's famous Freedom Trail, and enjoying one of New England's beaches.

In the words of our students, high school programs at Boston University Summer Term are "the perfect balance between academics and fun." I hope you will share this opportunity with your students by displaying the enclosed poster in your school.
