COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT IS THE WESTFIELD EDUCATION FOUNDATION?

The Westfield Education Foundation is a 501c(3) not for profit entity created in 1986 to serve as a philanthropic resource to provide scholarships to Westfield seniors and to provide grants to Westfield teachers.

WHAT IS THE FOUNDATION'S SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM?

The Foundation administers ten scholarship funds that provide twenty or more scholarships each academic year. Students apply for these scholarships directly to the Foundation.

WHY IS THERE A COMMON APPLICATION?

The common application enables students to provide one application that can be used for all scholarship funds that the student may qualify.

MAY I RECEIVE AWARDS FROM MORE THAN ONE SCHOLARSHIP?

No, the Foundation Board has expressly indicated a position to provide financial support for as many Westfield seniors as possible. Therefore, each student selected for one scholarship will not be considered for a second.

AM I ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

Each scholarship fund has specific eligibility criteria that were defined by the Foundation and the donors when the funds were established. Please read through specific criteria starting on the next page to see if you are eligible for any of the scholarship funds. The general criteria that applies to all the funds is as follows:

- Be a resident of the state of Indiana.
- Be a citizen of the United States.

WHAT IS THE DEADLINE TO APPLY?

Application materials for all scholarships must be received in the Counseling Center no later than **March 28, 2019**. All materials should be sent together. The Counseling Center will submit your transcript with your application.

WHEN WILL RECIPIENTS BE ANNOUNCED?

The names of the scholarship recipients will be announced during the annual WHS Senior Awards Night.

WHAT CAN SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS BE USED FOR?

The scholarships are for educational expenses: tuition and fees, books and supplies, room and board, and miscellaneous expenses unless otherwise noted.

ARE SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS TAXABLE?

For degree-seeking students, a scholarship used for tuition, fees, and books and supplies is not taxable. Any portion of the scholarship that is used for room and board or miscellaneous expenses is taxable. Consult a tax expert for advice.

IF I AM AWARDED A SCHOLARSHIP, HOW MUCH WILL I GET?

None of the scholarship funds have set award amounts. Each year the Foundation Board determines the number of scholarships and the amount based upon investment earnings and contributions. Our scholarship funds have awards ranging from \$500 to \$3,000 per recipient. The number of scholarships and the amount awarded for the previous academic year are listed under the fund's description.

IF I AM SELECTED, DO I GET A CHECK?

No, the scholarship awards are sent directly to your school's office of the bursar after submitting documentation of your enrollment in an approved university or college. You will be asked to work with the treasurer of Westfield Washington Schools to process payment to the college or university.

WHERE CAN I GO TO SCHOOL WITH THESE SCHOLARSHIPS?

All of the scholarships are for schools anywhere in the United States with the exception of the Crosser Scholarship which requires an Indiana school.

DO I NEED TO PAY SCHOLARSHIP MONEY BACK?

No. These are charitable awards that do not need to be paid back.

DOES THE FOUNDATION MAKE THE DECISIONS ABOUT WHO IS SELECTED?

Yes, all the scholarship funds administered by the Foundation have provisions for the Board to make the final selections for all scholarships. Scholarship recipients will be determined through a "blind" review of applications. Students' names will not be made available to the Foundation Board of Directors during the selection process.

IF I RECEIVE A SCHOLARSHIP ONE YEAR, WILL I AUTOMATICALLY RECEIVE AN AWARD FOR THE FOLLOWING YEAR?

No, the current position of the Foundation Board is to provide as many "new" educational opportunities each year as possible with the scholarship funds available.

SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

**** ALL SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE FOR GIRL OR BOY GRADUATING FROM WESTFIELD HS, UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED.**

THE DR. AND MRS. MALCOLM BRAY SCIENCE SCHOLARSHIP FUND

This scholarship, established by Dr. and Mrs. Bray, is to recognize academic achievement for a boy or girl who is planning a career in the field of science or technology. Dr. Bray was a researcher at Eli Lilly and Company, lived in Washington Township, and after his retirement he and his wife continued to be significant supporters of all efforts to promote education in Hamilton County and Westfield in particular.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Four years of math and science courses at Westfield High School
- Student must major in a science or technology curriculum
- Student should be near the top of class in academic achievement
- Demonstrate leadership in school or community activities

AWARD AMOUNT: \$3,000, two awarded in 2018

THE WWEDF SCHOLARSHIP FUND

This scholarship is funded through unrestricted donations given directly to the Foundation since its founding in 1986. Scholarships have been given from this fund since 1989.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Have a better than average grade point average (GPA)
- A primary consideration shall be financial need
- Demonstrate leadership in school and community activities
- Enroll in school full time with any career choice

AWARD AMOUNT: \$2,000, two awarded in 2018

THE REBECCA STURDEVANT SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Rebecca Sturdevant Scholarship was established by a Westfield High School graduate to promote further education of girls from Westfield High School. Scholarships have been given from this fund since 1987.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- *A senior girl graduating from Westfield High School*
- Intend to pursue a major in any science field
- Above average GPA
- Primary focus on academic achievement
- Preference is given students who plan to enroll in school full time
- Other considerations:
 - Participation in extra-curricular activities and involvement in the community

AWARD AMOUNT: \$2,000, five awarded in 2018

THE JAMES W. "BILL" WOOD SCHOLARSHIP FUND

This scholarship was established by Mr. Wood, a former Board member of the Foundation and graduate of Westfield High School. Mr. Wood's interest was in providing an educational opportunity for someone who demonstrated academic achievement, but needed some financial help to begin their education. Scholarships have been awarded from this fund since 1997.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Have a better than average GPA
- A primary consideration shall be financial need
- Participation in school and community activities
- Enroll in school full time with any career choice

AWARD AMOUNT: \$2,000, one awarded in 2018

THE HORIZON SCHOLARSHIP FUND

This scholarship was established by a local Westfield family to promote academic achievement while adhering to the guiding principles of responsibility, hard work, respect, compassion, and honesty as set forth by Westfield Washington Schools (WWS).

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher
- Demonstrate guiding principles of WWS
- Demonstrate academic achievement
- Active in school extracurricular activities
- Enroll as a full time student in an institution of higher learning (vocational or academic; two-year or four-year course of study)

AWARD AMOUNT: \$1,000, one awarded in 2018

THE SODEXO FOOD SERVICES SCHOLARSHIP FUND

This scholarship was established to promote further education of students from Westfield High School.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Have an average GPA
- Demonstrate guiding principles of WWS
- A primary consideration will be financial need
- Participation in school and community activities
- Enroll in an institution of higher learning (vocational, trade, academic)

AWARD AMOUNT: \$1,000, five awarded in 2018

THE RICHARD H. CROSSER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

This scholarship was established by Richard H. Crosser, co-founder of Crossman Communities. Crossman Communities made donations to scholarship funds in the communities where its homes were built.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Demonstrate a GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Display a commitment to school and community
- Student to complete a two or four year degree program at an Indiana college or university, majoring in structural engineering, architecture, drafting, business, finance, accounting or another field related to the building trades

AWARD AMOUNT: \$700, one awarded in 2018

THE ZIPPARO FAMILY B.E.C.I.S. SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established by a Westfield family to benefit students majoring in business, engineering, or computer information systems.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Have a 3.5 or higher GPA
- Student must attend a four year college or university, majoring in business, engineering, or computer information systems
- Demonstrates character following the five guiding principles of Westfield Washington Schools

AWARD AMOUNT: \$500, one awarded in 2018

SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

THE RALPH WILFONG AND MILDRED WILFONG SCHOLARSHIP FUND

This scholarship was established by Ralph and Mildred Wilfong. Mr. Wilfong was a local residential and commercial developer in Washington Township.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Have an average GPA
- A primary consideration shall be financial need
- Demonstrate all guiding principles of WWS
- Participate in school and community activities
- Enroll in school with any career choice

AWARD AMOUNT: \$500, two awarded in 2018

THE TRIBUTE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established by Dr. Mark Keen, retired Westfield Washington Schools Superintendent.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Have a 3.5 or higher GPA
- Student has actively been involved in the community
- Demonstrates character following the five guiding principles of Westfield Washington Schools

AWARD AMOUNT: \$700, one awarded in 2018

THE ROBERT J. DENARI SCIENCE EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established to memorialize "Bio Bob" Denari's enthusiasm for science – and his students – during his 40 year teaching career. This annual scholarship will be given to a Westfield High School graduating senior who shares this enthusiasm by pursuing a career in the sciences.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Four years of science courses at Westfield High School
- Has a GPA of at least 3.0
- Demonstrates leadership in community or extra-curricular activities
- Student intends to complete a four-year degree program, majoring in science
- Vividly demonstrates an enthusiasm for, and plans a career in, the sciences

AWARD AMOUNT: \$550, one awarded in 2018

THE GRAND JUNCTION BREWING COMPANY SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established by The Grand Junction Brewing Company, a local Westfield business.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Enroll in an institution of higher learning (two or four year degree program at college or at a vocational/trade school)
- **Essay required** (500-750 words) on the student's future plans and how this scholarship would help

AWARD AMOUNT: \$1,500, two awarded in 2018

SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

THE SHIRLEY GIBBS SCHOLARSHIP

This new scholarship was established by a Westfield High School graduate through a planned gift in her Estate Settlement. It is to benefit graduating seniors or alumni from Westfield High School with a demonstrated need for financial assistance to obtain further education.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Enroll in post-secondary education at a trade school, technical college, or university
- May be pursuing undergraduate or graduate studies
- Demonstrate financial need
