COMMUNITY PROFILE

Westfield High School is a public high school located in Westfield, Indiana. It is the only high school in the Westfield Washington School District. The district is comprised of 1 high school, 1 middle school, 1 intermediate school and 6 elementary schools. Westfield is a rapidly growing community 20 miles north of downtown Indianapolis. Westfield High School is accredited by the Indiana Department of Education.

ENROLLMENT DATA

Enrollment for 2023-2024 is **2,809 students with 640 seniors, 679 juniors, 708 sophomores and 770 freshmen.** The faculty consists of 130 licensed staff. Eighty percent of our licensed staff have a masters degree or higher.

CURRICULUM

Westfield High School is on a trimester schedule. Class periods are 67 minutes long and meet five days per week. Each trimester is 12 weeks long. Classes are one trimester, two trimesters or three trimesters in length. Students receive one credit per trimester for each course successfully completed. Students have an opportunity to earn fifteen credits each year. Westfield High School offers 30 AP classes and 23 dual-credit courses this year. Dual-credit opportunities are offered through Indiana University's ACP program, Butler University, and Ivy Tech.

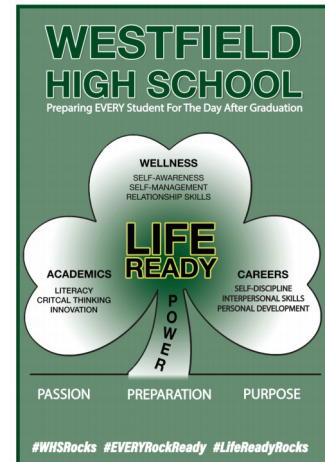
MISSION

To equip and empower students with skills and opportunities as they become Life Ready.

In order to ensure that Westfield students are ready for the day after graduation and beyond, there is a focus on development and teaching skills in three major areas: Academic, Career and Wellness. The Academic leaf focus is to continue to raise the achievement level of ALL students. The focus, in respect to the Wellness component is to improve the physical and mental wellness of each student now and in the future. The Career leaf prepares students for the day after graduation through student services such as Career Awareness, Career Exploration and Career Pathways.

RECOGNITION

Westfield High School has been listed as #723 in the nation and #11 in the state on the US News and World Report's Best High Schools list. Students continue to exceed participation and success goals in College Board's Advanced Placement program. In 2023, 85% of AP students attained a score of three and higher on Advanced Placement examination.



GRADING AND CLASS RANK

Westfield High School does not rank students. Top performing students are recognized as Distinguished Graduates (4.30 GPA or higher) and Honored Graduates (4.20-4.29 GPA). The GPA calculations include 0.5 additional quality points for honors courses in the core academic areas and 1.0 additional quality points for AP or Dual Credit courses.

 The AP Capstone Diploma, conferred by the College Board, is an innovative and prestigious diploma program that gives students an opportunity to apply critical thinking, collaborative problem solving, and research skills across a cross-curricular context.
